FRENCH SCENE OF ANOTHER ROBBERY

SANTA FE SAFE TOUCHED
FOR \$400 IN CASH

Suspect Arrested Here Last
Night With Revolver Taken
from Strong Box Tells Conflicting
Stories.

The little station of French, the scene of the sensational robbery several months ago, of the Santa Fe company's safe, when \$10,000 in currency was secured, was the scene of another robbery Monday night, when the Santa Fe safe was broken open and some \$400 in money and several hundred dollars worth of checks were taken.

In the arrest last night of a man giving the name of Claude Martin, a local officer, Ben Williams, believed to have one, at least, of the men who were implicated in the robbery. After, whose name may be Martin, and who gave conflicting stories concerning his more recent movements, was brought in on train No. 2 last night and held in the city jail for the night. He was arrested without much trouble.

Among other things taken from the Santa Fe station at French, was a Smith and Wesson revolver, bearing the number 1199. In his work on the case the Santa Fe officer found that a grip containing a Smith and Wesson revolver had been stolen from a passenger on a Santa Fe train. The officer found the man who had stolen the grip and when placed under arrest he pointed out the man from whom he had stolen it. The arrest followed. The grip in question was secured and was found to contain the missing revolver. After, when arrested last night, seemed confused and told varying stories of his movements during the past few days. Among his possessions were a letter to a woman, a skating rink manager recommending the man as an experienced skating rink employee. This letter of recommendation was in the name of Claude Martin. There was also a newspaper clipping telling of the movement of a man named Claude Martin with a woman. After says the clipping does not refer to him. He had no money on his person when arrested.

FRENCHMAN DENIES
CANAL BOND TALE

M. Lemarque Says There Has Never
Been an American Syndicate.

Paris, Dec. 22.—In view of the possible congressional investigation in the United States into the Panama canal purchase, M. Lemarque, receiver of the old company, made the following statement today:

"While I don't desire to go into details, I don't hesitate in speaking from personal knowledge, to round the story of the existence of an American syndicate, to which the purchase money is supposed eventually to have gone, as a false statement out of which a false report has been made by the court. It would be improper for me to say that. Both tradition and practice make it impossible for me to disclose the list of individual bondholders to whom the money was distributed."

Should any official investigation be ordered in the United States, M. Lemarque explained, it would rest with the court to decide what information could be legally furnished. He declined to discuss whether there were any American bondholders, and if so, to state even approximately the percentage of the total amount they received.

Another authority asserts that the American interest in the canal was insignificant, being confined merely to a single New York banker. He estimated the amount that went in America as well below \$500,000.

Lots of Cash for Inauguration.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 22.—It seems that nothing is to be made by an inauguration a success, that of President-elect William H. Taft on March 4, next, will be the greatest the country has ever seen.

Already Chairman Clegg of the Finance committee has in his possession a guarantee fund of \$10,000,000 which is \$7,000,000 larger than the amount received four years ago, and it is expected that before the inauguration the fund will be considerably larger.

The chief source of revenue for the inauguration fund is the inauguration tax, which brought \$4,000,000 four years ago. The income from the preceding inauguration was \$2,000,000. It is expected there will be at least \$20,000,000 in Washington at the inauguration time.

"I WOULD GO TO HELL
TO KILL ANNIS"

Said Thornton Hains to Police-
man After His Arrest on Murder
Charge; State's Case
Nears End.

[By Morning Journal Special Leased Wire] Buffalo, N. Y., Dec. 22.—Scorning the close of the case against Thornton J. Hains, in a pamphlet in the killing of William H. Annis, who was shot down by Captain J. Hains last summer, the prosecution today brought out a letter written by the defendant, thus opening the way for Thornton Hains' lawyers to bring to light those incidents in Captain Hains' martial career which brought about the tragedy.

The letter was written last June by the defendant to Julian Ripley. In it the defendant, Hains, as a "friend," and "comrade" and accused him of betraying his brother's wife.

Private Attorney Darrin offered the letter in evidence as preliminary to the testimony of Mr. Ripley, concerning a second letter from the defendant, which the witness has deposed. Justice Kane would not permit Mr. Ripley to testify concerning the second letter.

The introduction of the letter, said Mr. Darrin, tonight, "paves the way for us to show what were the facts in Captain Hains' life, with respect to the defendant, and the defendant's conduct."

Policeman Eugene Dalton testified that Thornton Hains during the summer, moved from his home in Buffalo, N. Y., to the city of Buffalo, N. Y., and that he was in the city at the time of the shooting of William H. Annis.
