On Nov. 22, Honduran President Jose Azcona Hoyo rejected the Nicaraguan call for a summit to discuss violence in El Salvador. He said time was too short to accept the proposal by President Daniel Ortega. Azcona said he would attend the summit scheduled for Dec. 8 in Managua as long as the president-elect decides to attend. On Nov. 26, Hondurans will vote in general elections. The new president will take office on Jan. 27. (Basic data from AP, 11/21/89)
