Effective Nov. 17, the Nicaraguan cordoba was devalued for the 30th time this year. The exchange rate was established at 28,600 per US dollar, representing a 4% devaluation. Consumer price inflation for the month of October was 10.2%. (Basic data from Xinhua, 11/17/89)
