Salvadoran Diplomats Leave Managua

On Nov. 29, Salvadoran diplomats closed their embassy in Managua. Charge d'affaires Roberto Lopez Geissman insisted there was no break in relations between the two countries. At the airport, he told reporters, "Unfortunately there's been speculation that there's a break in relations between El Salvador and Nicaragua, which is not true. It's not even a suspension...It's a re-calling for consultations. Of course it's much graver because it's the whole diplomatic and consular delegation" that is leaving Managua. The Nicaraguan government had previously withdrawn its diplomatic personnel from San Salvador, result of constant death threats. (Basic data from Notimex, AP, 11/29/89)
