Following the violence at the UNO rally in Masatepe on Dec. 10, two activists resigned from the opposition coalition. According to Nicaragua Network, in the past several weeks approximately 30 UNO candidates have resigned. Reasons given for resignation include disagreement with UNO tactics during the electoral process, the presence of former contras and Somoza's National Guard within UNO, and disagreement with decisions affecting all members of parties in the coalition made by a small conservative cabal.
