## **Panama: Notes On Salary Cuts For Top-level Government Officials**

Salary cuts for Panama's top four tiers of government officials are estimated to save the treasury over \$2.1 million per year. The monthly salary of the president was reduced from \$7,000 to \$4,000. The remaining \$3,000 per month will be accessible as an expense account. The 12 cabinet members, 67 legislators, nine Supreme Court of Justice magistrates, three Electoral Tribunal magistrates, and Attorney General, among other positions that previously were entitled to up to \$10,000 per month, will now receive \$3,000. Another \$2,000 will be accessible in the form of an expense account. The government has also named a committee of three judges who will attempt to regain control of assets said to have been illegally acquired by ousted Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega.
