On March 1 during a congressional hearing, Secretary of State James Baker said that \$7.3 million in "humanitarian aid" for the contras remain to be disbursed. Of the total, \$3.8 million will be spent providing food, clothing and medical supplies to the contras camped in Honduras until May 1. The rest, or \$3.5 million, will be the minimum the US contributes to finance their repatriation. (Basic data from Notimex, 03/01/90)
