Brazil: Collor De Mello Leads In Poll

In a poll by Datafolha released Nov. 25, Fernando Collor de Mello had 48% support, compared to 39% for Luis Inacio da Silva. Collor de Mello won 28% of the votes in the Nov. 15 presidential election, and da Silva, 16%. The two will participate in a runoff Dec. 17. Datafolha surveyed 5,716 people nationwide on Nov. 22-24. The margin of error was 2%. Seven percent of respondents were undecided, while 6% said they would annul their ballots. (Basic data from AP, 11/25/89)
