According to statements by police spokespersons in Lima on Nov. 22, over \$5 million of counterfeit US currency recently distributed in Peru was brought in by persons connected with drug traffickers based in Cali, Colombia. Police confirmed the detention of former police sergeant Luis Francisco Gonzalez Vallejos, who reportedly handled the counterfeit operation between the two countries.
