Panama: Peruvian Government Demands Protection For Embassy Facilities & Personnel

On March 6, the Peruvian Foreign Ministry requested that the Panamanian government provide protection for its embassy facilities and personnel in Panama City. The request followed an attack on March 3 by unidentified persons, apparently in retaliation for Peru's offering of asylum to several officers of the dismantled Panamanian Defense Forces. The ministry request condemned the attack, and demanded fulfillment of the 1954 Caracas Convention agreements referring to the right of asylum. (Basic data from Notimex, 03/06/90)
