## **Panama: Two U.s Sergeants Involved In Drug Trafficking Ring**

On March 7 in Miami, US Attorney Dexter Lehtinen told reporters that sergeants Raphael Fultz and Jarvis Worelds sent cocaine to the US from Panama in duffle bags through the US Army postal service. At least 17 Colombians and a Panamanian were involved, said Lehtinen. The sergeants made their first "delivery" in October 1989, according to court documents, and they later sent more than 50 kg. of the drug to the US. Lehtinen denied any link between the drug trafficking group and an attack March 2 on a bar in Panama City. (See CAU, 03/07/90.) (Basic data from AFP, 03/07/90)
