Argentina & Britain Begin Talks To Avoid Future Military Conflicts

On Dec. 5 in Montevideo, Argentina and Britain commenced talks to develop safeguards for preventing any new armed conflict between the two nations. The talks on Tuesday were taking place at the Argentine Embassy, and the following day's session was scheduled for the British Embassy. Sources at both embassies said the objective of the talks was "to create a climate of mutual confidence" and to avoid possible clashes between naval and air force patrols in the region around the Malvinas-Falkland islands.
