Argentina: \$4.699 Billion Trade Surplus, January-october

According to a recent report by the National Statistics and Census Institute (INDEC), Argentina's trade surplus for the first 10 months of the year was \$4.699 billion, a 65.8% increase over the same period last year. Export revenues totaled \$7.477 billion, and imports, \$3.579 billion. Argentina's major customers were the US (\$899 million), Netherlands (\$798 million), Soviet Union (\$710 million), and Brazil (\$780 million). Principal sources of imports were the US (\$651 million), Brazil (\$558 million), West Germany (\$305 million), and Italy (\$195 million).
