Nicaraguan Government Requests Members Of Guerrilla Organizations To Leave Country

On March 20, Notimex reported that sources in Managua connected to political exiles said that the Nicaraguan government has requested all "irregular groups" to leave the country. The Honduran national congress is to discuss this week approval of a law which guarantees the safety of Hondurans who are currently living in Nicaragua. Notimex's sources said members of the Salvadoran Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN), and of Honduran and Guatemalan guerrilla organizations were asked to leave because the government could no longer ensure their safety after president-elect Violeta Barrios de Chamorro is installed on April 25.
