On March 22, Cuban Ambassador Lazaro Mora was given five days to leave Panama. The Panamanian government said that other ambassadors would be given the same treatment if their governments fail to recognize President Guillermo Endara. Foreign Minister Julio Linares told reporters that Panama was close to breaking all diplomatic relations with Havana. He said Cuban officials had argued that the real ruler of Panama was US Southern Command chief, Gen. Marc Cisneros. (Basic data from AFP, 03/22/90)
