Honduran President Says Regional Summit May Be Postponed Until May

On March 25 in San Salvador, Honduran President Rafael Callejas said that the regional summit planned for next weekend in Nicaragua, would likely be postponed until May due to "problems of coordination and time." Callejas said that he plans to visit Washington, Salvadoran President Alfredo Cristiani will be visiting Caracas, and Guatemalan President Vinicio Cerezo has commitments at home. In response to a reporter's question, Callejas confirmed that his government will request indemnization payments from Washington for damage caused by the presence of the Nicaraguan contras in southern Honduras. Later in day, upon arrival in San Jose, Costa Rica, Callejas told reporters that the contras should be demobilized before April 20 in order to facilitate a peaceful transition in Nicaragua.
