Nicaragua To Request \$100 Million At Donor Conference In Rome

In Miami on June 2, Central Bank president Francisco Mayorga told reporters that the Nicaraguan government needs another \$100 million in emergency economic aid. Mayorga was en route to a conference of 30 donor nations scheduled for June 6-7 in Rome. The official said Nicaragua's emergency financial requirements total \$350 million. With the recent approval of \$250 million in aid by the US Congress, \$100 million in the form of donations and concessionary credits are to be provided by West Germany, Spain, Switzerland, Italy and Japan. Nicaragua has already received \$212 million from European nations for the current fiscal year. Meanwhile in Managua, a statement by the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN) said the Nicaraguan delegation in Rome will include Sergio Ramirez, former vice president and current leader of the FSLN bloc in the National Assembly.
