## **El Salvador: Rebels Report Detention Of Mexican Professor & Journalist By National Police**

In a statement released June 4 in San Salvador, the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN) reported that free-lance journalist and professor at the Universidad Mexicana de Guadalajara, Maria Eugenia Ochoa, was detained May 31 in western San Salvador by National Police agents. According to the rebels, the professor was taken to National Police headquarters. The FMLN demanded that the government and the military high command respect Ochoa's "physical and moral integrity," and requested that the Mexican embassy in San Salvador and humanitarian organizations use their offices to ensure her rights.
