## **El Salvador: Opposition Political Leader Ruben Zamora Denounces Military Use Of U.N. For Propaganda Purposes**

At a press conference on July 17, opposition leader Ruben Zamora said the army had threatened UN mediation in the peace talks by using the organization's name for propagandistic purposes. Zamora is secretary general of the Popular Social Christian Movement (MPSC). Zamora displayed for reporters a flyer dropped by the air force over several communities in western El Salvador. The flyer displayed a picture of a presumed UN official asserting that the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN) was the worst violator of human rights in El Salvador. Zamora also denounced the torture and killing of agricultural worker Eusebio Vazquez Lopez on the Pasadena ranch near the village of Nejapa (21 km. from San Salvador) by the Artillery Brigade. The MPSC, said Zamora, joined other organizations in condemning the detention and interrogation of labor leader Jorge Lopez. Lopez said police interrogated him about the location of Zamora's residence, and those of other opposition politicians. Leader of the Treasury Ministry employees' union, Lopez was detained July 8 and released the past weekend. (Basic data from Notimex, 07/17/90)
