## **Over 1,700 Nicaraguans In Costa Rica To Be Repatriated**

On July 18, UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and Costa Rican government officials told reporters that under a joint program, over 1,700 Nicaraguans would be repatriated in the next few weeks, beginning with a contingent of 272 on Wednesday. According to government statistics, thus far in 1990 1,477 Nicaraguans have returned home from Costa Rica. Negotiations between the Nicaraguan and Costa Rican governments are focused on accelerating the repatriation process via the Los Chiles border post, and the Limon port toward Bluefields.
