Nicaragua: Northern Atlantic Coast Declared Disaster Area Result Of Flooding

After 14 days of flooding, the northern Atlantic Coast was declared a disaster area last week. An estimated 60,000 people and 150 communities have been affected. At least four persons have been killed. The Cuban government responded to President Violeta Barrios de Chamorro's request for assistance within 24 hours, providing over 12 tons of food and 23 physicians. The Nicaraguan army was called out to evacuate the injured, move equipment, and participate in community work brigades. [Basic data from 07/21/90 report by Nicaragua Network (Washington, DC)]
