On July 30 in statements to a local radio station, National Workers Front (FNT) leader Edgardo Garcia said the government has violated agreements established with the Front on July 13 following a general strike. The government, he said, has dismissed large numbers of workers and delivered threats to others, while in the countryside entire families have been forcibly removed from their homes. The FNT is comprised of seven union federations described as linked or sympathetic to the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN). (Basic data from AFP, 07/30/90)
