## **El Salvador: Military Officer Accused Of Destroying Key Evidence In Jesuit Murder Case Released On Bail**

On July 31, Judge Ricardo Zamora ordered the release on bail of Lt.Col. Camilo Hernandez, who is accused of having destroyed key evidence in the murders of six Jesuit priests last November. Lt. Yushi Mendoza, also implicated in the multiple murder case, said Hernandez, then assistant director of the military academy in San Salvador, ordered Mendoza to burn log books on the comings and goings of military personnel during the evening and early morning hours preceding the killings.
