## **El Salvador: On Reactions To Results Of Fourth Round Of Peace Talks**

After the conclusion of the fourth round of peace talks between representatives of the Salvadoran government and the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN) on Aug. 22, Salvadoran public school teachers announced a three-day strike, and the country's largest labor confederation, the National Salvadoran Workers Unity (UNTS), threatened work slow-downs if the government persists in "maintaining its intransigent attitude." The teachers' strike was scheduled to begin on Aug. 27. In response, the government authorized orders for establishing a plethora of military checkpoints, and patrols throughout San Salvador. Heavily armed soldiers accompanied by tanks cruised downtown streets on Friday, Aug. 24. (Basic data from Notimex, 08/24/90)
