Japan Pays More For Mexican Oil Imports In January

Japanese oil importers paid between 28 and 30 cents more per barrel of Mexican crude in January. Notimex cited unidentified Japanese importers who added that prices across the board rose to 1986 levels. The price of Mexican light crude (Isthmus) reached \$18.18 per barrel, and for heavy crude (Maya), \$15.26. Japan is Mexico's third largest oil customer, after the US and Spain.
