State Department Advises U.S. Citizens To Avoid Travel In Eastern & Northern El Salvador

On Aug. 25, the US State Department issued an advisory warning citizens to avoid travel in eastern and northern El Salvador, and to use caution when traveling elsewhere in the country. The advisory said that the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN) is "particularly active" in the above regions, and continues to launch sporadic attacks in San Salvador. US citizens traveling to El Salvador are advised to select flights arriving before 5:30 p.m., avoid going out on the streets after 1 a.m., and to register at the US Embassy immediately upon arrival.
