Panama: Poll Shows Declining Support For Endara Government

According to a recent poll published by daily newspaper La Prensa on Aug. 27, about 40% of Panamanians would vote for the present government installed in power during the US invasion were an election held in the next 30 days. The poll was conducted between Aug. 7 and 15 for La Prensa. A poll conducted in April showed 84% of Panamanians had a favorable view of the government. Survey results indicated that 51.8% would support a "third force" candidate independent of both former Gen. Manuel Antonio Noriega loyalists and the present government.
