## **E.e.c. Funds Not To Be Disbursed Until Costa Rica Joins Economic Integration Efforts**

On Sept. 5, Salvadoran Vice President Francisco Merino told reporters that Central American vice presidents planned to meet Sept. 7 to discuss regional economic integration, and the establishment of a Central American Parliament. The parliament may be established, said Merino, in 1991 when members are elected in Nicaragua, Guatemala and El Salvador. According to Merino, Costa Rica's "negligence" in failing to join the parliament "affects nothing." The European Economic Community recently approved \$20 million to facilitate Central American integration. According to Merino, the EEC funds will not be disbursed until Costa Rica decides to join the integration effort. (Basic data from ACAN-EFE, 09/05/90)
