On Sept. 25, the Honduran government implemented a program of gasoline and diesel savings by imposing limits on the use of its vehicles. Vehicles bearing license plates ending in even numbers must be parked on Tuesday and Thursday, and those ending in odd numbers are to be parked on Wednesdays and Fridays. All government vehicles can be used on Mondays, but all must be parked on weekends. (Basic data from ACAN-EFE, 09/25/90)
