On Sept. 25, Costa Rican Economy Minister Gonzalo Fajardo told reporters that in October officials of the five Central American governments plan a meeting to discuss arrangements for a free trade agreement with Mexico. Such agreement with Mexico, said Fajardo, would facilitate Central American penetration of the US market within the context of a US-Mexico free trade accord.
