Nicaraguan Government Declares Two Days Of National Mourning

On Oct. 2, the Nicaraguan government decreed two days of national mourning in honor of Carlos Nunez, who died Oct. 1 in Cuba. Nunez, the youngest member of the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN) directorate at 37, served as president of the National Assembly under the previous government. Since President Violeta Barrios de Chamorro's government was installed in April, Nunez held a seat in the Assembly representing the FSLN. Nunez died of an incurable disease in a Cuban hospital. His remains were due to arrive in Managua Oct. 3. (Basic data from AFP, 10/03/90)
