On Sept. 29, pro-government Civilian Sovereign Radio reported that at about 1 a.m. two men in a car machine-gunned the Las Garzas presidential palace Saturday, then fled. President Guillermo Endara was attending the UN General Assembly in New York. Last week the press reported that police had exchanged fire with an unidentified ship about three kilometers from Las Garzas, located near the Gulf of Panama.
