Nicaragua: Business Organization Says Conciliatory Attitude Toward F.s.l.n. Displays Government's Weakness

In a communique published Oct. 2 in Managua, the Superior Council of Private Enterprise (COSEP) described the government as "weak" due to its conciliatory attitude toward the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN). COSEP called on President Violeta Barrios de Chamorro's government to revoke and modify decrees approved by the former administration which effectively obligate Chamorro to negotiate with the Sandinistas. Next, COSEP insisted that all property confiscated by the Sandinista government be returned to former owners. Privatization of state-run companies, said the communique, is necessary to establish the framework for "social and economic stability." (Basic data from AFP, 10/02/90)
