## **Costa Rica May Be Included In Free-trade Program Plans By Mexico, Colombia & Venezuela**

On Oct. 1, Costa Rican ambassador to Mexico, Alvaro Aguilar Peralta, said San Jose may be included in the free trade program being developed by Mexico, Colombia and Venezuela. Peralta said Mexico's future free trade agreement with the US is important for Costa Rica, particularly in the areas of agricultural machinery, coffee and textiles.
