Honduras: Union Leader Assassinated

On Oct. 6, police reported that the body of Oscar Aguilera, president of the United Transport Union (STUH), was found on Oct. 3 by police in Choluteca, located south of Tegucigalpa. Aguilera was kidnapped Oct. 2 by unidentified persons, and later assassinated by his captors. Family members identified the body on Saturday. The kidnappers had reportedly demanded a ransom equivalent to \$34,000. Delivery of the ransom money did not take place because the kidnappers failed to appear at a designated location to collect.
