## **Nicaragua: Land Takeover Results In One Dead, Several Wounded**

On Oct. 9, Interior Ministry spokesperson Frank Cesar said agricultural worker Carlos Eurarios was killed and several other persons injured during a shootout Oct. 9 on a private farm near Yasica Sur, 105 km. north of Managua. About 12 police attempted to remove about 30 families led by former contras. Police Capt. Mario Medina, deputy national police chief in the region, said police agent Edwin Cisne was also killed, but that his death had not yet been confirmed. He said at least four other people were wounded. Also on Monday, a group of agricultural workers destroyed a car owned by Eduardo Callejas when he attempted to recover land confiscated in 1980 by the previous government. The acreage had been turned into a cooperative for 50 families. (Basic data from AP, 10/09/90)
