On Oct. 16, about 1,000 women marched through the streets of downtown Tegucigalpa to protest government economic policies, blamed for causing widespread hunger. The demonstrators called on the government to reduce "exaggerated prices" on basic consumer goods. According to official statistics, 70% of Honduran households are impoverished.
