Honduras: 15,000 Demonstrate Against Government's Economic Policies

On Nov. 7, an estimated 15,000 people marched through the streets of Tegucigalpa protesting the government's economic readjustment policies, mainly price hikes on basic goods and services. The march was organized by the Plataforma de Lucha, comprised of the country's confederations of trade unions, agricultural workers, and rural cooperatives. Protesters carried placards and banners condemning the government's inflationary policies, and denounced pressures by the International Monetary Fund, World Bank, and the US Agency for International Development.
