On Nov. 5, in a unanimous vote, the 15-member UN Security Council reduced the size of the UN border patrol force in Central America (UN Observer Group in Central America-ONUCA), and extended its mandate by six months. The council also voted to cut the number of helicopters from 12 to six, sending home nearly all of a 130-member Canadian air force unit. (Basic data from AP, 11/05/90)
