U.S. Anti-drug Abuse Program May Be Introduced In Honduras

On Nov. 11 in Tegucigalpa, US narcotics police sergeant George Ibarra told reporters that Honduras continues to be a major drug trans-shipment point. He said that the drug traffic brings \$11 billion per year into Honduras. Ibarra was visiting Honduras to promote the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) program introduced in the US in 1984.
