## **Guatemala: Update On Election Results**

[Erratum: An election returns report appearing in the Nov. 14 issue of the CAU said the Plan de Avanzada Nacional (PAN) had received a majority of the votes cast for members of the national congress. The figure quoted was based on a small proportion of ballots cast in the election. Accurate percentages based on the vote count for congressional seats as of Nov. 15 appear below.] The two front-runners, Jorge Carpio Nicolle of the National Center Union (UCN), and Jorge Serrano of the Solidarity Action Movement (MAS) will compete in a Jan. 6 runoff. On Nov. 15, the Supreme Electoral Tribunal reported that the National Center Union (UCN) had won 41 of 116 seats in the national legislature; the Christian Democrat party, 29; the Solidarity Action Movement (MAS), 19; and, former general Efraim Rios Montt's "No Venta" alliance, 10. Abstentionism was over 50% in El Quiche, Huehuetenango, Alta Verapaz, Peten and Izabal departments. (Basic data from AFP, 11/13/90, 11/15/90)
