O.e.c.d.'s Year-end 1989 Foreign Debt Totals For Central American Countries (s/s)

On Nov. 19 in Paris, the Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) released a report on Third World nations' foreign debt totals on Dec. 31, 1989. As a whole, developing countries owed foreign creditors \$1.38 billion more than at year-end 1988. Latin American nations' foreign debt increased by \$428.205 million. According to the report, a total of 87% of the Third World foreign debt was contracted with creditors in the OECD's 24 member-nations. Appearing below are Central American nations' foreign debt as of Dec. 31, 1989. Costa Rica \$ 4.905 billion El Salvador 2.266 Guatemala 3.117 Honduras 3.524 Nicaragua 8.386 Panama 6.410 (Basic data from EFE, 11/19/90)
