According to a May 29 report by the Banco de Mexico, the consumer price index in the first half of May rose 0.9%. Items contributing most heavily to the increase were housing rent, medical services, automobiles, urban bus fare, and a variety of foodstuffs, including restaurant meals, beans, oranges, beer, chiles and eggs.
