## **El Salvador: Anniversary Of Jesuit Murders Commemorated In U.S. With Prayer Vigils & Civil Disobedience**

On Nov. 16, demonstrations against US aid to El Salvador took place Los Angeles, New York and Boston. In Los Angeles, police arrested 113 of approximately 400 protesters blocking access to a federal building which has been the site of weekly demonstrations since the massacre of the six priests and two women last year. In New York, about half of 100 demonstrators were arrested for similar acts of civil disobedience. Boston Mayor Raymond Flynn announced a city-wide boycott of Folger's coffee and other Salvadoran imports. An estimated 75 persons participated in vigils at a university and St. Paul's Cathedral. Boston is the 10th US city to publicly endorse the Salvadoran coffee boycott. (Basic data from AFP, 11/17/90)
