## **El Salvador: Union Leader Disappeared, & Son Abducted**

On Nov. 30 at a press conference in San Salvador, Telecommunications Association Workers (ASTELL) spokespersons accused the military high command of responsibility for the disappearance of union leader and Social Democratic Party member Ricardo Bazan, and the illegal arrest of his son, Edward Bazan. ASTELL leader Humberto Centeno said "death squad types" searched the Bazan home, and upon failing to locate Ricardo, they arrested Edward. The heavily armed civilians, he added, had no arrest warrant. Ricardo Bazan was "disappeared" 48 hours after his son's arrest. (Basic data from Notimex, 12/02/90)
