Nicaragua: Costa Rican Government Requests Pre-extradition Detention Of Fugitive John Hull

On Dec. 9, *Barricada*, official newspaper of the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN), reported that the Costa Rican government had requested that Nicaraguan authorities arrest fugitive John Hull "for the purpose of extradition." The Nicaraguan Foreign Ministry confirmed the Costa Rican request. (See CAU 12/07/90 for background on Hull.) Hull disappeared last week after his residency in Nicaragua was made public. According to *Barricada*, Nicaraguan officials believe Hull has left the country. In a Dec. 10 report, ACAN-EFE quoted the Costa Rican daily newspaper *La Nacion* as saying that Hull "could be found" in El Salvador. The *La Nacion* article offered no details on the subject.
