Guatemala: Rebels Call For Peace Talks

In a Feb. 5 communique published in the daily newspaper La Prensa, the Guatemalan National Revolutionary Unity (URNG) called for peace talks with the government and the armed forces to be mediated by the National Reconciliation Commission, and witnessed by UN observers. The URNG said that peace talks were the only means for consolidating the process toward a political solution to the nation's crisis and the armed conflict. The URNG also called on the government to guarantee respect for human rights and to prosecute persons responsible for abuses. The communique added that "violations have increased at an alarming rate in recent months." (Basic data from ACAN-EFE, 02/05/91)
