Mexico: State-run Oil Company Confirms Additional 100,000 Barrels Of Crude Exported To U.S.

On Aug. 10, the state-run oil company, PEMEX, reported that it would place an additional 100,000 barrels of crude per day at the disposition of the United States. PEMEX has 16 private clients in the US, which ranks as the Mexico's largest oil importer at nearly 650,000 barrels per day. Mexico exports an average 1.22 million barrels per day, and its principal clients, aside from the US, are Spain and Japan. The additional oil deliveries to the US are expected to bring in an extra \$375 million in export revenues. (Basic data from AFP, 08/10/90)
