On Feb. 16, the armed forces press office (COPREFA) reported the discovery in Chalatenango department of four partially decomposed corpses. The four were believed to have been killed in a clash between soldiers and the Farabundo Marti National Liberation Front (FMLN) on Feb. 10. According to COPREFA, two of the dead were Salvadoran rebels. The other two, a man and a woman, were described as foreigners fighting alongside FMLN units. (Basic data from AFP, 02/16/91)
