On April 25, US Ambassador to Honduras Crescencio Arcos stated that proposed military budget cuts will not affect the presence of 1,100 US troops at the Palmerola base in Comayagua department. Palmerola houses an air force academy for Honduran pilots, and the US "task force" which operates the most extensive electronic surveillance center in Central America.
